

York College Gender Pay Report: Snapshot Date 31st March 2025

Mean Gender Pay Gap

As at the snapshot date, the average rate of pay for males was £1.52/hour more than that of females. This represents a *mean pay gap of 8.2%.*

The previous mean pay gap was 6.5%, so the median has increased by 1.7 percentage points.

Median Gender Pay Gap

The median pay gap (rather than the mean pay gap) is the principal headline rate that is published. The median rate of pay for males was £0.87/hour more than that of females. This represents a *median pay gap of 5.1%*.

The previous median pay gap was 6.1%, so the gap has narrowed by 1.0 percentage point. Both male and female median pay increased, but female pay rose slightly faster, helping reduce the gap.
