Further Education and Higher Education Admissions Policy

Overview

This policy covers admissions to all course beginning in 2026 at York College ("the College")

A full listing of courses available can be found on our website.

This policy is the responsibility of the Admissions Manager and will be updated annually (last updated 6th October 2025).

The procedures within the Admissions Policy are the responsibility of the Admissions and Information department but may be undertaken by other teams within the College.

The York College Values

Success – providing individual advice and guidance to applicants on the right course for them.

Ambition – clear course information and progression routes identified.

Respect – commitment to a fair and transparent process for all applicants.

Care – by providing timely and appropriate information through the Admissions process.

Right to refuse admission

The College reserves the right to reject an application, including but not exclusively for the following reasons:

- If an applicant is unable to demonstrate the minimum entry requirements for the course and is not committed to undertaking these
- If the course applied for is undersubscribed (with the result that its delivery in not viable for the College or its students) or oversubscribed or if the College is, for whatever reason, unable to deliver the course or programme applied for.
- If an applicant has a criminal conviction which prevents them from undertaking the course.
- If the applicant has specific physical, medical, social or curriculum needs which the College considers, in its reasonable opinion, that it is unable to meet.
- If the applicant has previously been subject to the College disciplinary process which prevents re-Admissions, either within a designated time frame or indefinitely.

1. Further Education Application Process

1.1 Introduction

This policy covers admissions to further education programmes for September 2026 entry. This includes A Level, Vocational, T Level, Access and Apprenticeship programmes.

1.2 Application information

All applications must be made directly to the College using the online application available on our website. In exceptional circumstances a paper form can be provided, especially where students are experiencing difficulty accessing IT facilities. These are available from York College, or you can download a form from our website by visiting: http://www.yorkcollege.ac.uk/apply

1.3 When to apply

You can apply from the beginning of the Autumn term for the next academic year. We will start processing applications from October. There is no fixed deadline for applications, however we would advise that you send in your application as soon as you can as applications for courses can be stopped when capacity is reached.

1.4 Deferred Applications / Gap Year

Applications should be submitted for the following academic year. Deferred applications will not normally be accepted, though in extraordinary circumstances they can be authorised by the Heads of Curriculum.

1.5 International / Overseas Applicants

Applications from International students aged 16-18, who have turned 16 by June 2026, are welcomed by the College and are considered in-line with our typical entrance requirements and we would expect previous qualifications to be of an equivalent level. Proof of English Language proficiency will be required at IELTS level 6.0.

Applications need to be submitted via an approved agency. In exceptional circumstances where an application is submitted without an agent and deemed viable Admissions and International Team an application fee of £300 will be charged for your application to be processed. This fee does not guarantee you entry to York College. As part of your application, you may be asked to submit further information to assess funding and equivalent qualifications.

1.7 Application Process Flow

 Application is received and processed by the Admissions Team and an acknowledgment email is sent to the applicant within 7 days. For Creative courses, digitial portfolios are required. For Performing Arts courses, auditions are required. • We recommend that all applicants attend a York College Open Event before applying. However, applicants who are predicted to meet the course entry requirements will usually recieve an offer without an interview. Applicants who do not meet this criteria or those with an EHCP or those who have declared a criminal conviciton may be invited to a telephone or viritual Guidance Discussion before an offer is issued. Applications received after the end of the Summer term will be invited to main enrolment to discuss potential courses. • When an offer is made applicants will recieve an Offer Confirmation email confirming details of the offer and any conditions or entry requirements that apply. • A Level & T Level enrolment will take place on 23rd June 2026 at our Welcome Fest. Enrolment is subject to achieving the required grades on GCSE results day. We will review your achieved grades via your Personal Learner Record. We will then contact you if you have not acheived the grades to give further advice & guidance and invite you in to our main enrolment period. Main enrolment takes place from 20th-28th August 2026. Applicants will be notified of their enrolment appointment in early August 2026. Enrolment takes place at York College face to face. Applicants must attend their designated enrolment appointment or at least attend in the main enrolment period to secure a place on their offered course (this is also subject to the Right to Refuse Admission policy on page 2 of this document).

1.8 Entrance Requirements

The typical entrance requirements for our Further Education courses can be found in the York College course guide or on our website. Course specific entry requirements will be detailed in the Offer Confirmation Email.

The majority of students aged under 19 are eligible for free courses and will not have to pay for the remainder of the programme should they become nineteen at any point during the course. 2.3 When to apply

You can apply from the beginning of the Autumn term for the next academic year. We will start processing applications from October. There is no deadline for applications, however we would advise that you send in your application as soon as you can as courses can be closed when they reach capacity.

2.5 International / Overseas Applicants



2.11 Fees, Scholarships and Funding

Depending on your previous qualifications and residency history, you may be eligible for a tuition fee loan to help with the fees for your full or part-time higher education degree. If you choose to take out a tuition fee loan, you will not have to pay any upfront fees. Student Finance will pay the tuition fee on your behalf directly to the College. 2.12 Criminal Convictions

A criminal conviction (spent, unspent or pending) does not necessarily preclude an applicant from entry to a course at the College. However, it may necessitate staff of the College seeking additional references relating to the applicant and the preparation of a risk assessment should the applicant be accepted onto a study programme.
